FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS Call to Order and Roll Call

Mr. Filak called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Ms. Montagna called the roll and indicated a quorum was present for the meeting.

SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS Pledge of Allegiance

THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS Approval of the Meeting Agenda

FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Public Comment Period

Mr. David Arena commented on being the liaison for garden club, complimented the tree replacement process, discussed planting an honor tree and other memorial trees every year some to be donated to the District and to CROA, and additional opportunities within the community.

Discussion ensued regarding rights-of-way areas between the sidewalk and curb, District's ownership of trees but no obligation to maintain the parkway areas, change from trimming within five feet of a private residence due to liability and insurance issues, the District trims trees due to safety, current trimming contract and schedule, 18 feet over roads and 10 feet over sidewalk, removal of reference to distance from a structure, issue of letting homeowners trim trees as they prefer, trimming in other districts, and CROA design guidelines,

Mr. Filak made a MOTION to approve Resolution 2023-06, setting a rulemaking hearing governing road parkways/verges for Tuesday, April 25, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. Ms. Starks seconded the motion.

Upon VOICE VOTE, with all in favor, unanimous approval was given to Resolution 2023-06, setting a rulemaking hearing governing road parkways/verges for Tuesday, April 25, 2023, at 6:00 p.m.

Regular Reports

A. District Manager

i. Audit Engagement Letter from McDirmit Davis to Perform Fiscal Year 2022 Audit

Discussion ensued regarding the standard form engagement letter that was executed and is to be ratified, and the fiscal year 2022 audit is nearly complete.

Mr. McLaughlin made a MOTION to ratify the engagement letter with McDirmit Davis to perform the fiscal year 2022 audit, in the amount of \$5,000.

Ms. Starks seconded the motion.

Upon VOICE VOTE, with all in favor, unanimous approval was given to ratify the engagement letter with McDirmit Davis to perform the fiscal year 2022 audit, in the amount of \$5,000.

ii. Campus Suite Website Maintenance

i. Monthly Field Management Report

The field management report is included in the agenda package and available in the District Office for public review during normal business hours.

ii. Update on Eastlawn Berm

Discussion ensued regarding Eastlawn repair is complete, Reedy Creek Improvement District ("RCID") has further requirements to rebuild spreader swale, Island Village next phase expected to break ground in April, outstanding punch list, Island Village steps in Phase 1A, root barriers were done on Celebration Boulevard but not in the rest of Island Village, request to require root barriers be installed going forward, and cost per foot to install root barriers.

Mr. Filak made a MOTION to set a rulemaking hearing for April 25, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. related to requiring root barriers on newly installed hardwood trees next to hardscape, including but not limited to adjacent to sidewalks and alleys. Mr. Touzin seconded the motion.

Upon VOICE VOTE, with all in favor, unanimous approval was given to set a rulemaking hearing for April 25, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. related to requiring root barriers on newly installed hardwood trees next to hardscape, including but not limited to adjacent to sidewalks and alleys.

iii. Proposals for Roofing Inspections for the Office Building

Discussion ensued regarding the proposals for roofing inspections, leak issues, desire for engineering inspection, and update on insurance claim.

Mr. McLaughlin made a MOTION to spend an amount not to exceed \$7,500 for roofing inspections for the office building, subject to approval by the Chairman if in excess of \$7,500.

Ms. Starks seconded the motion.

Upon VOICE VOTE, with all in favor, unanimous approval was given to spend an amount not to exceed \$7,500 for roofing inspections for the office building, subject to approval by the Chairman if in excess of \$7,500.

Discussion ensued regarding proposals from roofing companies to inspect shade structures, and request to ratify Service Works proposal due to Jurin's request to use the District's lift.

Ms. Starks made a MOTION to ratify the proposal from Service Works to provide roof leak inspection services, in an amount not to exceed \$3,500.

Mr. McLaughlin seconded the motion.

Discussion inspection being scheduled to run tests and look for leaks and inspect all aspects of the roof, perhaps coordinate with the engineer, and potential coordination with CROA's work on their building.

Upon VOICE VOTE, with all in favor, unanimous approval was given to ratify the proposal from Service Works to provide roof leak inspection services, in an amount not to exceed \$3,500.

iv. Proposal from Florida Green for Tree Trimming

Discussion ensued regarding crepe myrtle pruning, example of pencil pruning on Rush Street, option in the proposal to flat top, annual pruning, question how far to prune back, need for consistency, crepe myrtles are pruned more for aesthetics, previous pruning practices, and suggestion to consider crepe myrtles an exception.

Mr. McLaughlin made a MOTION to approve the proposal from Florida Green for option 2 trimming crepe myrtles two inches below the knots, in the amount of \$26,550.

Mr. Touzin seconded the motion.

Discussion possible precedent, Lake Evalyn trees were flat topped, options for pruning, and results of various pruning practices.

Upon VOICE VOTE, with all in favor, unanimous approval was given to the proposal from Florida Green for option 2 trimming crepe myrtles two inches below the knots, in the amount of \$26,550.

v. Proposal from SŌLitude Lake Management for Pond Plantings

Discussion ensued regarding adding canna on Water Street.

Mr. McLaughlin made a MOTION to approve the proposal from SŌLitude Lake Management for pond plantings in ponds C1, C2, and C3, in the amount of \$3,720.

Mr. Touzin seconded the motion.

Upon VOICE VOTE, with all in favor, unanimous approval was given to the proposal from SŌLitude Lake Management for pond plantings in ponds C1, C2, and C3, in the amount of \$3,720.

vi. Proposal from SŌLitude Lake Management for Aeration Maintenance

Discussion ensued regarding this work not within staff's purview and might void the warranty, SŌLitude will need to provide the parts, and status of other fountains.

Mr. Filak made a MOTION to approve the proposal from SŌLitude Lake Management for aeration maintenance, in the amount of \$3,850, to be billed quarterly in the amount of \$962.50.

Mr. Touzin seconded the motion.

vii. Furniture Replacement on the Esplanade

Discussion ensued regarding options for furniture replacements, desire for further research, repairs will continue to be made in the meantime, materials for replacements, security plan to help deter damages would be discussed in a closed executive session, and suggestion to order one Adirondack chair as a sample.

Discussion ensued regarding current use of room, limited policy previously approved, impetus for the request, and staff not available for events after business hours.

ii. Miscellaneous

Discussion ensued regarding State's action for RCID and no impact to the District.

D. Engineer

The engineering monthly report is included in the agenda package and available in the District Office for public review during normal business hours.

Discussion ensued regarding Island Village Phase 2B plans submitted, retaining walls, desire not to own retaining walls, possibility to own the wall and have CROA maintain it, suggestion to table the conversation until next month, options for ownership other than the District, and pond erosion.

i. Confirmation of Liaison Roles

Discussion ensued regarding liaisons as listed, removing Island Village.

NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Discussion Items

A. GoGov Option to Replace CeleService

Discussion ensued regarding demonstration for CeleService replacement, staff continues to research other options, use of tablets to assist staff, positive comments related to the service, conversion timing and process, CROA renewed CeleService, timing will allow conversion to a new system, options if CROA does not want to participate in the new system, District will own the contract that is shared with CROA but CROA would manage its own complaints, publicity campaign, how the app will work, possible sharing with CNOA and Enterprise CDD, and limitations of CeleService.

This item will be included on the agenda for the next meeting.

TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Other Business, Updates, and Supervisor Comments

Mr. Filak discussed vacuum truck from Osceola County, anniversary of Inframark contract, scoring cards to be sent to Board members and returned to the attorney, and process for meeting with Mr. Chris Tarase.

Mr. Touzin discussed leaf fall season, piles of leaves left in the street, homeowners need to be responsible to clean up their own leaves, revised proposal from Juniper to pick up piles and street sweeper cleans the streets, need for additional sweeps, lack of County enforcement, education and penalties from the County might help compliance, limitations of the District in enforcement, District picks up leaves on the streets to prevent clogs in stormwater drains, and management to engage a vendor for one trip with a vacuum truck.

Mr. Filak discussed engaging other CDDs in the County to participate in a council to address frustrations and the lack of response with the County, comments that it will result in the County no longer working with the districts, and suggestion for the County to meet with representatives of multiple CDDs.

This will be a discussion item at the next meeting.

A Resident made general comments related to attending the meeting.

TWELFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Adjournment

Indemnification: Applicant shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the CCDD and the officers, supervisors, agents, employees, and assigns of the CCDD from and against any and all claims, demands, suits, judgments, losses, or expenses of any nature whatsoever (including, without limitation, attorneys' fees, costs, and disbursements, whether of in-house or outside counsel and whether or not an action is brought, on appeal or otherwise), arising from or out of, or relating to, directly or indirectly, any act or omission of Applicant, its officers, directors, agents, employees, invitees, and or guests (collectively. "Applicant's Representatives") including, without limitation, any failure of Applicant or Applicant's Representatives to comply with the terms, conditions, and/or provisions of this AGREEMENT.
- 4. Sovereign Immunity: Nothing herein shall cause or be construed as a waiver of the CCDD's sovereign immunity or limitations on liability granted pursuant to Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, or other law, and nothing in this Agreement shall mure to the benefit of any third party for the purpose of allowing any claim which could otherwise be barred under the Doctrine of Sovereign Immunity or by operation of law.
- Compliance with Law: Applicant shall comply, and cause all of Applicant's Representatives to comply, with all applicable laws, rules, ordinances, and
 other legal requirements applicable to Applicant's and Applicant's Representatives use of the Area
- 6. <u>Damage to Property</u>: Applicant shall be responsible for any damage caused to any real or personal property caused by Applicant and/or Applicant's Representatives. CCDD shall not be responsible for any injury or damage to Applicant or Applicant's Representatives or their respective property. The CCDD shall send an invoice to the Applicant following the Special Event, and Applicant shall make payment to the CCDD within fourteen (14) days of the Special Event.
- "As is" Condition: Applicant accepts the use of the Area in its "as is condition." The CCDD shall have no obligation to make any changes thereto. The
 CCDD shall have no obligation to provide any utilities to the Area. Applicant has inspected the Area prior to filing its Application and is aware of the
 Area's current condition.
- Rules and Regulations: Applicant and Applicant's Representatives shall comply with the CCDD's Special Event Policy, as well as the following requirements:
 - a) Neither Applicant nor Applicant's Representatives shall engage in any conduct that might tend to interfere with or impede the use and enjoyment of any other portion of the CCDD by any other person or entity including, without limitation, creating any objectionable noise, sound or odor.

 - d) Applicant and Applicant's Representatives shall comply with any additional Rules and Regulations attached hereto.
- 9 Right to Use Only This AGREEMENT is not intended to, and shall not be deemed to, create a lease or any other interest in real property, but shall merely give Applicant and Applicant's Representatives the right to use the Area as and when provided above
- 10. Other Conditions. Depending upon the nature of the Special Event and the Area, the CCDD reserves the right to require in addition to the requirements of the Special Event Policy, as a condition of using the Area:
 - a) Additional Certificate of Insurance (form, type, limits, and coverage approved by CCDD) with respect to the Area and the Special Event.
 - b) Security appropriate for the Special Event and the Area;
 - c) Additional bond or deposit to cover cleanup/repair costs;
 - d) Payment of professional fees related to the review of the Application and/or fees to cover costs incurred by the CCDD during the Special Event; and/or
 - e) Such other conditions or limitations reasonably related to mitigating impacts to the Area because of the Special Event

Celebration Community Development District From the Board of Supervisors

Landscaping

The Celebration CDD ("District") has continually worked to maintain the infrastructure of Celebration including street lights, flood control, sidewalks, etc. Recently we have worked with our new vendor regarding pond maintenance and have seen excellent results. They have been extremely responsive. One of the areas that the District has begun to focus on is the landscaping of the public areas, such as parks, entrance ways, and roadways. In the next six months, you will begin to see work begin done in the following areas:

Water Street Canal

Grass has been trimmed a foot from the canna lilies and all weeds have been removed. At March's Board meeting, the Board of Supervisors approved the purchase of additional canna lilies to fill in the areas that are missing. Additional bushes will be planted in areas where a few are missing. This is being done to resolve issues to the original approved landscaping plan and limit costs rather than replace perfectly healthy bushes and trees.

Celebration Avenue Entrance (S.R. 417/North Village)

Some minor tree trimming is scheduled along with grass replacements on both sides of the street. Some additional grass replacements will occur on Celebration Boulevard at the entrance to North Village. These grass replacements will be partially paid for by the landscaping company per their contract agreement. There are fence repairs that will also occur. Power washing of light posts and fences have already been completed. The red roof on the pavilion located on the Celebration Avenue bridge is scheduled to be replaced this year.

Celebration Avenue (851 to East Village)

Requests for estimates have been submitted to replace some of the missing plants on the brick wall adjacent to Lake Evalyn. A landscaping plan has been requested to address some of the dead areas. The intersection of Celebration Avenue and Eastlawn/Westpark will have additional landscaping added and as many existing plants as possible will be kept. The trees along this area have already been trimmed.

Celebration Boulevard

There has been a significant deterioration of the grass along Celebration Boulevard, and District management has addressed this directly with the District's landscaping vendor who will be paying for the resodding of this area. This will include medians and the grass next to the sidewalks.

Downtown

Market Square has had new lights installed that illuminate the trees. Resetting of bricks is scheduled for next year to resolve drainage issues, and additional landscaping will be added to fill in some dead spots.

New benches are scheduled to be installed next fiscal year surrounding the lake. Additional landscaping will be added which includes St. Augustine grass and wild grass to freshen the area and address dead spots. There are numerous sidewalk issues here that will be addressed to make the area safer and more accessible for everyone. In addition, the roofs for the pavilions will be replaced on the corner of Bloom Street and Front Street.

These are the initial items planned for this year. In the next two months, additional phases of improvement will be developed for each village on the main roads and a review of landscaping and repaving of alleyways per a defined schedule. This will include focused sidewalk repairs, as well.

The goal is to enhance our town in steps while being financially responsible, hold our vendors accountable, and phase in repairs based on our budget cycle. By focusing our limited resources on smart planning, we feel we can maintain Celebration's beauty and vital infrastructure.

Rule Governing Road Parkways/Verges

Memorandum Celebration Community Development District

To: Board of Supervisors

From: District Counsel, Jan Carpenter and Jay Lazarovich

Re: Maintenance of the Road Parkway/Verge, including trees

This memo provides a brief discussion of the responsibilities related to the ownership and maintenance of the lawn area between the roadway curb and the inside edge of the sidewalk (the "Road Parkway/Verge").

Engineer's Reports and Construction History

The original Engineers' Reports from 1994 and 1997 (which provided the initial master infrastructure for all of Celebration, do not provide a lot of specific data, but confirm that the District paid for the roadway construction. Roads were thereafter turned over to Osceola County, who accepted only the asphalt paving roadbed (i.e., the County owns the roads "curb to curb"). The District therefore retains ownership of the Road Parkway/Verge and the sidewalks. The District installed the trees in the parkways and continues to own them.

Plats

There are numerous recorded plats for the various villages and commercial areas in Celebration. Based on a quick review of plats from a few of the existing villages, Road Parkway/Verge and the sidewalks were dedicated/conveyed to the District by the Celebration Company for perpetual ownership. Repair and maintenance of those parcels is not mentioned.

Master Declaration

Section 6.1 of the Amended and Restated Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions (the "CC&R's") for the residential lots provides for the maintenance of the Road Parkway/Verge by the landowner:

6.1. Maintenance by Owners

Each Owner shall maintain his or her Unit, including all structures, parking areas, landscaping, and other improvements comprising the Unit, in a manner consistent with the Governing Documents and the Community-Wide Standard, unless such maintenance responsibility is otherwise assumed by or assigned to the Association or a Neighborhood Association pursuant to this Charter, any Supplement, or by law.

Each Owner shall also be responsible for maintaining, mowing, replacing sod, pruning, and irrigating the landscaping within that portion of any adjacent Common Area or public right-of-way, street, or alley lying between the Unit boundary and any wall, fence, or curb located on the Common Area or public right-of-way, street, or alley in a manner consistent with the Governing Documents and Community-Wide Standard, unless responsibility for maintaining such landscaped areas has been assigned to or assumed by the Association. However, Owners may not remove trees, shrubs, or similar vegetation from this area without prior approval pursuant to Chapter 5 [ARC provisions].

In addition to any other enforcement rights, if an Owner fails properly to perform his or her maintenance responsibility, the Association may perform such maintenance responsibilities and assess all costs incurred by the Association against the Unit and the Owner in accordance with Section 12-4. The Association shall afford the Owner notice and a reasonable opportunity to cure the problem prior to entry, except when entry is required due to an emergency situation.

These provisions require the homeowner to maintain the Road Parkway/Verge and all landscaping and trees within the area unless the CC&RS are supplanted by a neighborhood association or a condominium association which provides for the association to maintain. Homeowners need ARC approval to remove "trees or shrubs." In either instance, the private parties are to maintain the area.

Summary and Conclusion

The District owns the Road Parkway/Verge and therefore has the right to maintain any or all of the landscaping and improvements, including trees; however, the responsibility to maintain the Road Parkway/Verge has been imposed on either the homeowner or the association depending on the CC&R's.

Because the District seeks to clarify that the District's maintenance of trees is solely to protect public health, safety and welfare, adopting a formal Rule of the District may be desired by the board. A copy of a proposed Rule is attached. Rule-making provides an opportunity for public input and also can establish remedies and fines for non-compliance

WHEREAS, the Board reviewed the Rule Governing Road Parkway/Verge, attached hereto as **Exhibit "A"** (the "Rule Governing Road Parkway/Verge"), and desires to hold the necessary public hearing regarding the adoption of said rules in accordance with Chapter 120 and Section 190.011, *Florida Statutes*.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE DISTRICT OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CELEBRATION COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, OSCEOLA COUNTY, FLORIDA:

- 1. That there is hereby declared a public hearing to be held on Tuesday, April 25, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. at the District Office, located at 313 Campus Street, Celebration, Florida, 34747, for the purpose of hearing comment and objection to the proposed Governing Road Parkway/Verge, and the adoption of said Governing Road Parkway/Verge. RULE GOVERNING ROAD PARKWAY/VERGE

Celebration Community Development District Rule Governing Road Parkway/Verge Area Maintenance

Law Implemented: ss. 120.69, 190.011, 190.012, Florida Statutes, (2022) Effective Date: April 25, 2023

In accordance with Chapters 190 and 120, Florida Statutes, and on April 25, 2023, at a duly noticed public meeting and after a duly noticed public hearing, the Board of Supervisors of the Celebration Community Development District adopted the following rules/policies to govern the maintenance and operation of the Road Parkway/Verge. Any and all prior rules/policies of the District governing this subject matter are hereby rescinded.

- 1. **1NTRODUCTION** & **FINDINGS**. This Rule Governing Road Parkway/Verge Area Maintenance ("**Rule**") addresses the installation, maintenance, repair, replacement and removal of improvements such as grass, landscaping and other improvements (together, "**Improvements**") within the Road Parkway/Verge, as defined herein. The following findings are made and determined, and incorporated herein as the factual basis for this Rule:
 - a. The Celebration Community Development District ("**District**") is a unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to the Uniform Community Development District Act of 1980, as codified in Chapter 190, Florida Statutes ("**Act**"), by Chapter 42Q-1, Florida Administrative Code, adopted by the Florida Land and Water Adjudicatory Commission effective March 29, 1994.
 - b. Pursuant to the Act, the District is authorized to construct, acquire, and maintain infrastructure improvements and services including, but not limited to, roadway systems and related improvements.
 - c. Section 190.012(3), Florida Statutes, specifically provides the District with the authority to:
 - "adopt and enforce appropriate rules following the procedures of Chapter 120, in connection with the provision of one or more services through its systems and facilities;" and
 - d. The District constructed certain public rights-of-way and conveyed the asphalt roadbed area only ("curb-to-curb") to Osceola County; the District owns the lawn area (from curb to sidewalk) and the sidewalks ("District Rights-of-Way") adjacent to the lots located within the community known as Celebration, and such District Rights-of-Way include the lawn area extending from the sidewalk edge closest to the road to the road curbs ("Road Parkway/Verge").
 - e. In addition to the District, portions of the Celebration community are served by a variety of homeowners associations, including, but not limited to, the Celebration Residential Owners Association, the Celebration Non-Residential Owners Association, a number of condominium associations and a number of sub-homeowners' associations (together, "Associations").

- f. The Associations' declarations of covenants (together, "**Declarations**") address the maintenance of the Road Parkway/Verge differently, with certain Declarations requiring the homeowner to maintain the Road Parkway/Verge and some requiring the Association to maintain the Road Parkway/Verge.
- g. It is in the best interest of the District to establish a rule for addressing landscaping, trees, and other improvements within the Road Parkway/Verge that present a threat to the health, safety, or welfare of the District's residents/landowners or the general public.
- 2. **EASEMENT.** Owners of individual lots and/or the Associations (as applicable, "**Responsible Party**"), as dictated by the applicable Declarations, are hereby granted the non-exclusive, revocable right to install, maintain, repair, replace, and remove improvements such as grass, landscaping, and other improvements (together "**Improvements**") within the Roadway Parkway/Verge. The term "Improvements" shall not include trees, which are owned by the District. Responsible Parties are granted a non-exclusive revocable right to maintain, repair, and prune all trees in the Road Parkway/Verge, with the District retaining the right to install and remove any trees. Such grant of rights is subject to the following conditions:
 - a. The Responsible Party shall be fully responsible for the installation, maintenance, repair, replacement, and removal of the Improvements. The Responsible Party shall be fully responsible for the maintenance, repair, and pruning of trees within the Road Parkway/Verge. The Responsible Party shall be fully responsible for the replacement of sod and landscaping to any altered area(s) as a result of the installation, maintenance, repair, replacement, pruning and/or removal of the trees within the Road Parkway/Verge.
 - b. The Responsible Party shall be responsible for ensuring that the installation, maintenance, repair, replacement, and removal of the Improvements and the maintenance, repair and pruning of trees, are conducted in compliance with all applicable laws and Association requirements (including but not limited to the Declarations, building codes, set back requirements, etc.).
 - c. District, by adopting this Rule, does not represent that District has authority to provide all necessary approvals relating to the Improvements and trees. Instead, the Responsible Party shall be responsible for obtaining any and all Association approvals (including Architectural Review, where applicable), permits and other approvals relating to the work.
 - d. The Responsible Party shall ensure that the installation, maintenance, repair, replacement and removal of the Improvements and the maintenance, repair and pruning of trees, does not damage any property of the District or any third party's property. In the event of any such damage, the Responsible Party shall immediately repair the damage or compensate the District for such repairs, at the District's option.
 - e. Responsible Party's exercise of rights hereunder shall not interfere with other existing rights (e.g., drainage easements, utility easements, etc.). It shall be the Responsible Party's responsibility to locate and identify any and all such improvements and/or utilities.
 - f. Upon completion of the installation, the Improvements will be owned by the Responsible Party, subject to the provisions of this Rule. The Responsible Party shall be responsible for such Improvements, and agree to maintain the Improvements in good condition and consistent with applicable law. Trees shall be owned by the District, but

maintained, repaired and pruned by the Responsible Party. Trees may not be removed by the Responsible Party without the prior written consent of the District (or any Associations, as applicable).

g. Additionally, the Responsible Party shall keep the Road Parkway/Verge free from any materialmen's or mechanic's liens and claims or notices in respect to such liens and claims, which arise by reason of the Responsible Party's exercise of rights under this Agreement, and the Responsible Party shall immediately discharge any such claim or lien.

3. **RESERVATIONS; ENFORCEMENT.**

- a. The District hereby acknowledges its right, but not any obligation, to maintain the Road Parkway/Verge for the limited purpose of addressing any issues that, in the District's sole discretion, may endanger the health, safety or welfare of the District's residents/landowners or the general public. By its adoption of this Rule, the District shall not be obligated nor is it affirmatively agreeing to monitor or otherwise assess the condition of the Road Parkway/Verge. Any maintenance assumed by the District herein shall be undertaken on a case-by-case basis as the District is notified of any health, safety or welfare concern.
- b. Without notice, the District may maintain, repair, replace or remove, all or any portion or portions of the Improvements and/or trees, or otherwise take action, to address any issues within the Road Parkway/Verge that endanger the health, safety or welfare of the District's residents/landowners or the general public. In such case, the District is not obligated to re-install the Improvements and/or trees, and is not responsible for any damage to the Improvements and/or trees, or their supporting structure as a result of the removal.
- c. For any and each violation of this Rule, the District shall additionally have the right to impose a fine of up to the amount of One Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$1,000.00) and collect such fine plus its attorney's fees as a contractual lien or as otherwise provided pursuant to Florida law. Additionally, if any person is found to have committed any violation of this Rule, such person may additionally be subject to any applicable legal action, civil, or criminal in nature.
- 4. **INDEMNIFICATION.** The Responsible Party agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Osceola County and the District, as well as any officers, supervisors, managers, lawyers, engineers, agents, and representatives of the foregoing, against all liability for damages and expenses resulting from, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the exercise of the rights granted hereunder.
- 5. **NOTICE.** This Rule, and all rights and obligations contained herein, shall run with the land and be deemed appurtenant to all lots adjoining the District Rights-of-Way. The District shall record a notice in the public records of Osceola County, Florida informing third parties of the existence of this Rule.
- 6. **SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY.** Nothing herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability contained in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes, or other statutes or law.

- 7. **SEVERABILITY.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of these policies shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining provisions, or any part of the policies not held to be invalid or unenforceable.
- 8. **AMENDMENTS**; **WAIVERS**. The District in its sole discretion may amend or rescind this Rule, including any license or other rights granted hereunder, at any time and without further notice. Further, the District's Board by vote at a public meeting may elect in its sole discretion at any time to grant waivers to any of the provisions of this Rule on a case-by-case basis, and where doing so is in the best interest of the District.

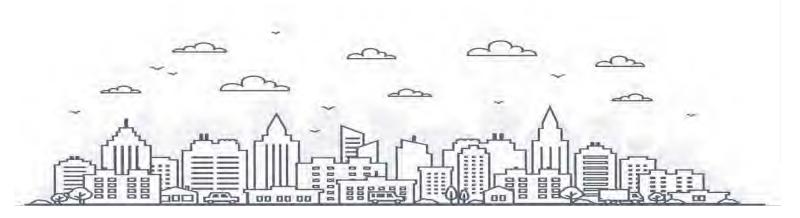

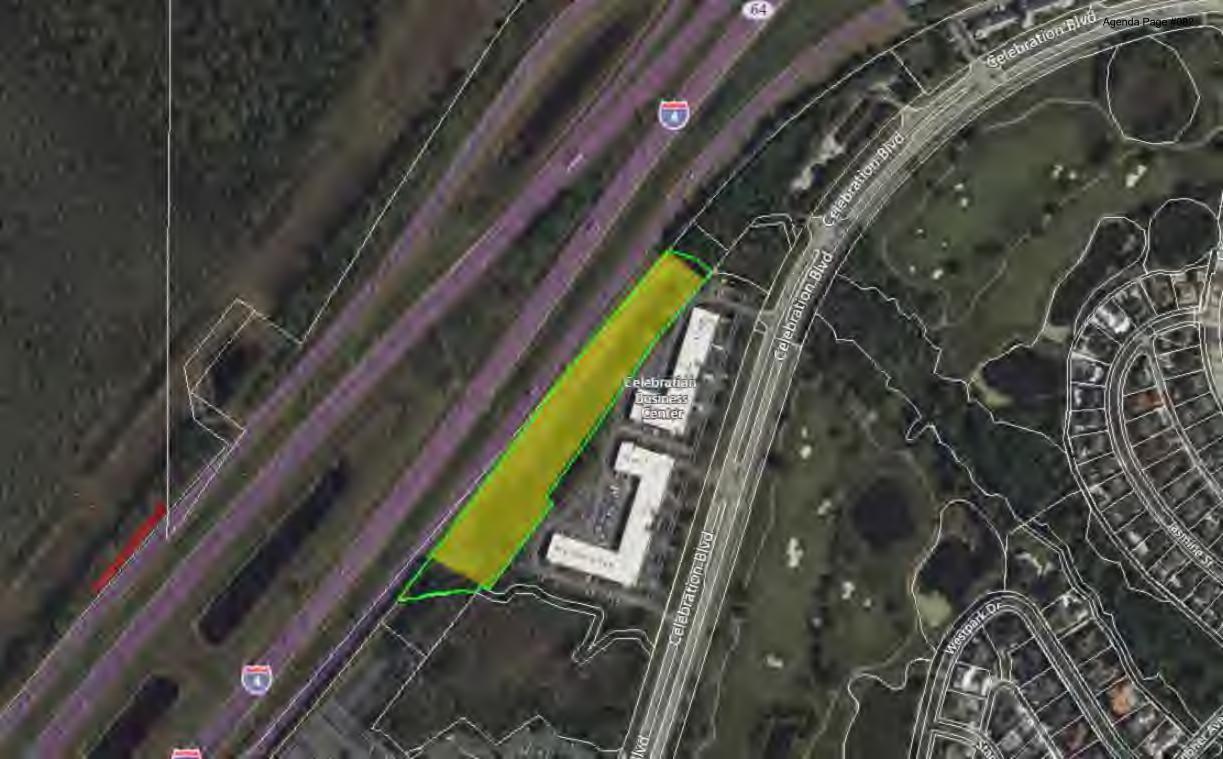

This agreement (the "Agreement") is made as of the date indicated above and is by and between SOLitude Lake Management, LLC ("SOLitude" or the "Company") and the customer identified above (the "Customer") on the terms and conditions set forth in this Agreement.

- 1. <u>The Services</u>. SOLitude will provide services at the Customer's property as described in Schedule A attached hereto:
- 2. PAYMENT TERMS. The Annual Contract Price is \$128,400.00. SOLitude shall invoice Customer \$10,700.00 per month for the Services to be provided under this Agreement. The term of this agreement is for a period of twelve (12) months, with payment invoiced on the first day of each month, reminding them that a contract payment is due by the end of that same month. - 5. <u>TERMINATION.</u> If SOLitude terminates your service for nonpayment or other default before the end of the Services Contract, if the Customer terminates this Services Contract for any reason other than in accordance with the cancellation policy outlined above, or in the event this Contract does not automatically renew and the customer terminates it before the termination date, Customer agrees to pay SOLitude, in addition to all other amounts owed, an Early Termination Fee in the amount specified below ("Early Termination Fee"). The Customer's Early Termination Fee will be 50% of the remaining value of the Contracted Price. The Early Termination Fee is not a penalty, but rather a charge to compensate SOLitude for the Customer's failure to satisfy the Services Contract on which the Customer's rate plan is based.
- 6. <u>INSURANCE AND LIMITATION OF LIABILITY</u>. SOLitude will maintain general liability and property damage insurance as necessary given the scope and nature of the Services. The Company will be responsible for those damages, claims, causes of action, injuries or legal costs to the extent of its own direct negligence or misconduct, and then only to an amount not to exceed the annual value of this Agreement. In no event will any party to this Agreement be liable to the other for incidental, consequential or purely economic damages.
- 7. <u>FORCE MAJEURE</u>. The Company shall not be liable for any delay in performing the Services, nor liable for any failure to provide the Services, due to any cause beyond its reasonable control.
- 8. <u>ANTI-CORRUPTION AND BRIBERY.</u> Each party represents that neither it nor anyone acting on its behalf has offered, given, requested or accepted any undue financial or other advantage of any kind in entering into this Agreement, and that it will comply with all applicable laws and regulations pertaining to corruption, competition and bribery in carrying out the terms and conditions of this Agreement.
- 9. <u>GOVERNING LAW</u>. This Agreement shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of the state in which the Services are performed.

- 10. <u>ENTIRE AGREEMENT</u>. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter and replaces any prior agreements or understandings, whether in writing or otherwise. This Agreement may not be modified or amended except by written agreement executed by both parties. In the event that any provision of this Agreement is determined to be void, invalid, or unenforceable, the validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected.
- 11. <u>NOTICE</u>. Any written notice provided under this Agreement may be sent via overnight mail, certified mail, hand delivery or electronic mail with delivery confirmation, to the individuals and addresses listed below.
- 12. <u>BINDING</u>. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the legal representatives and successors of the parties.
- 13. <u>FUEL/TRANSPORTATION SURCHARGE</u>. Like many other companies that are impacted by the price of gasoline, a rise in gasoline prices may necessitate a fuel surcharge. As such, the Company reserves the right to add a fuel surcharge to Customer's invoice for any increase in the cost of fuel as measured above the same time period in the prior year (by the National U.S. Average Motor Gasoline-Regular Fuel Price per Gallon Index reported by the U.S. Department of Energy). The surcharge may be adjusted monthly (up or down) with the price of gasoline.
- 14. <u>DISCLAIMER</u>. SOLitude is not responsible for the failure of any treatment, equipment installation, or other work that result from dam or other structural failures, severe weather and storms, flooding, or other acts of God that are outside of the control of SOLitude.

Customers understands and acknowledges that there are irrigation restrictions associated with many of the products used to treat lakes and ponds. The customer is responsible for notifying SOLitude in advance of the contract signing and the start of the contract if they utilize any of the water in their lakes or ponds for irrigation purposes. The customer accepts full responsibility for any issues that may arise from the irrigation of turf, ornamentals, trees, crops, or any other plants as a result of treated water being used by the customer for irrigation without the consent or knowledge of SOLitude.

Although there is rarely direct fish toxicity with the products used for treatment when applied at the labeled rate, or the installation and normal operation of the equipment we install, there is a risk under certain circumstances of significant dissolved oxygen drops. This risk is most severe in times of extremely hot weather and warm water temperatures, as these are the conditions during which dissolved oxygen levels are naturally at their lowest levels. Oftentimes lakes and ponds will experience natural fish kills under these conditions even if no work is performed. Every effort, to include the method and timing of application, the choice of products and equipment used, and the skill and training of the staff, is made to avoid such problems. However, the customer understands and accepts that there is always a slight risk of the occurrence of adverse conditions outside the control of SOLitude that will result in the death of some

fish and other aquatic life. The customer also understands and accepts that similar risks would remain even if no work was performed. The customer agrees to hold SOLitude harmless for any issues with fish or other aquatic life which occur as described above, or are otherwise outside the direct control of SOLitude, unless there is willful negligence on the part of SOLitude.

- 15. <u>NONPERFORMANCE</u>. In the case of any default on the part of the Company with respect to any of the terms of this Agreement, the Customer shall give written notice thereof, and if said default is not made good within (30) Thirty Days, the Customer shall notify the Company in writing that there has been a breach of the Agreement. The Company in case of such breach shall be entitled to receive payment only for work completed prior to said breach, so long as the total paid hereunder does not exceed the Contract sum.
- 16. <u>E-Verify</u>. Solitude Lake Management LLC utilizes the federal E-Verify program in contracts with public employers as required by Florida State law, and acknowledges all the provisions of Florida Statute 448.095 are incorporated herein by reference and hereby certifies it will comply with the same.

SCHEDULE A - SERVICES

<u>Monthly Inspection Report:</u> A monthly inspection report of 20 pond's will be provided to the CDD every month prior to the CDD meeting.

Water Quality Monitoring:

 Pond water samples will be taken and tested on Ten (10) ponds one time per year during the months of May through October (Ponds will be agreed upon with the CDD before testing will be started) for the following parameters:

Enhanced Waterbody Assessment

- **■** Testing included:
 - Water column profile for temperature and dissolved oxygen
 - Secchi disk reading
 - Surface and bottom sample analysis for the following
 - total phosphorus, total nitrogen, ammonia, total alkalinity, pH, conductivity, and turbidity
- Specialized Equipment: at depth water sampler, dissolved oxygen and temperature meter, pH meter, qps unit, and depth finder
- A formal report will be provided along with recommendations to improve overall waterbody condition

<u>Visual Inspections:</u>

- 1. A visual inspection of the pond(s) will be performed during each visit to the site. The inspections shall include the following:
 - Water levels
 - Water clarity or quality
 - Turbidity
 - Beneficial Aquatic Vegetation
 - Nuisance, Invasive, or Exotic Aquatic Vegetation
 - Algae
 - Physical components such as above ground pipes, inlet and outlet structures, trash racks, emergency spillways, and dams
 - Erosion
 - Issues with shoreline and bank stabilization measures such as rip rap stone, bulkheads, retaining walls, etc.
 - Forebays and inflowing or outflowing swales, ditches, and stream channels
 - Vegetated buffers
 - Sedimentation



- Nuisance animal activity
- Fish habitat
- Mosquito breeding conditions and habitat
- Trash and debris
- 2. Any issues or deficiencies that are observed during this visual monitoring will be documented by our staff in the field notes of the service order completed at the time the issue was first observed and reported to the Customer in writing as part of that month's service report.
- 3. Customer will be notified immediately if there are any deficiencies observed that appear in the judgment of our staff to be posing an immediate risk or otherwise jeopardizing the integrity of the pond(s) structures.
- 4. The scope of these services is limited to what can be reasonably observed at the surface of the water and above the ground around the water that makes up the physical structure of the pond(s). These routine inspection services are not intended to replace any requirement or need for a more comprehensive engineered inspection, or any other type of inspection that would require expertise or equipment to survey the condition of the physical components of the pond(s) underground, underwater, or inside any of the associated structures.

Aquatic Weed Control:

- 1. Pond(s) will be inspected on a **Six (6) times per month** basis.
- 2. Any growth of undesirable aquatic weeds and vegetation found in the pond(s) with each inspection shall be treated and controlled through the application of aquatic herbicides and aquatic surfactants as required to control the specific varieties of aquatic weeds and vegetation found in the pond(s) at the time of application.
- 3. Invasive and unwanted submersed and floating vegetation will be treated and controlled preventatively and curatively each spring and early summer through the use of systemic herbicides at the rate appropriate for control of the target species. Application rates will be designed to allow for selective control of unwanted species while allowing for desirable species of submersed and emergent wetland plants to prosper.

Shoreline Weed Control:

- 1. Shoreline areas will be inspected on a **Six (6) times per month** basis.
- 2. Any growth of cattails, phragmites, or other unwanted shoreline vegetation found within the pond areas shall be treated and controlled through the application of aquatic herbicides and aquatic surfactants as required for control of the plants present at time of application.



3. Any growth of unwanted plants or weeds growing in areas where stone has been installed for bank stabilization and erosion control shall be treated and controlled through the application of aquatic herbicides and aquatic surfactants as required to control the unwanted growth present at the time of application.

Littoral Shelf Control

- Littoral areas will be inspected and treated on an as-needed basis to maintain compliance with governing agencies for the management of all nuisance and exotic species.
- 2. Maintenance of future littoral plantings may necessitate an increased service level at an additional cost.
- 3. All Species will be killed in place with an approved herbicide,
- 4. This proposal does not include debris removal or disposal.

Pond Algae Control:

- 1. Pond(s) will be inspected on a **Six (6) times per month** basis.
- 2. Any algae found in the pond(s) with each inspection shall be treated and controlled through the application of algaecides, aquatic herbicides, and aquatic surfactants as needed for control of the algae present at the time of service.

Pond Dye:

1. **Pond Dye** will be applied to the pond(s) on an as **needed** basis. A combination of blue and/or black dye will be used as required to maintain a dark natural water color.

Trash Removal:

1. Trash and light debris will be removed from the pond(s) with each service and disposed off site. Any large item or debris that is not easily and reasonably removable by one person during the routine visit will be removed with the Customer's approval for an additional fee. Routine trash and debris removal services are for the pond areas only, and do not include any trash or debris removal from the surrounding terrestrial (dry land) areas.

Service Reporting:

1. Customer will be provided with a monthly service report detailing all of the work performed as part of this contract.



Permitting (when applicable):

- 1. SOLitude staff will be responsible for the following:
 - a. Obtaining any Federal, state, or local permits required to perform any work specified in this contract where applicable.
 - b. Attending any public hearings or meetings with regulators as required in support of the permitting process.
 - c. Filing of any notices or year-end reports with the appropriate agency as required by any related permit.
 - d. Notifying the Customer of any restrictions or special conditions put on the site with respect to any permit received, where applicable.

<u>Customer Responsibilities (when applicable):</u>

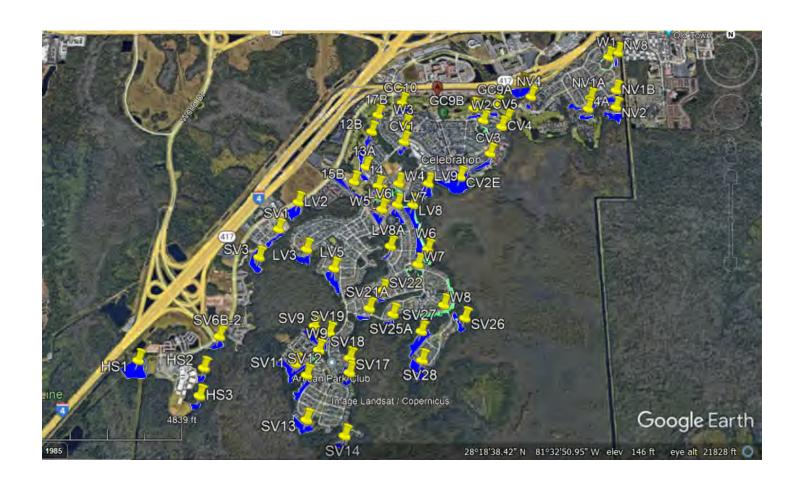
- 1. Customer will be responsible for the following:
 - a. Providing information required for the permit application process upon request.
 - b. Providing Certified Abutters List for abutter notification where required.
 - c. Perform any public filings or recordings with any agency or commission associated with the permitting process, if required.
 - d. Compliance with any other special requirements or conditions required by the local municipality.
 - e. Compliance and enforcement of temporary water-use restrictions where applicable.

General Qualifications:

- 1. Company is a licensed pesticide applicator in the state in which service is to be provided.
- 2. Individual Applicators are Certified Pesticide Applicators in Aquatics, Public Health, Forestry, Right of Way, and Turf/Ornamental as required in the state in which service is to be provided.
- 3. Company is a SePRO Preferred Applicator and dedicated Steward of Water. Each individual applicator has been trained and educated in the water quality testing and analysis required for prescriptive site-specific water quality management and utilizes an integrated approach that encompasses all aspects of ecologically balanced management. Each applicator has received extensive training in the proper selection, use, and application of all aquatic herbicides, algaecides, adjuvants, and water quality enhancement products necessary to properly treat our Customers' lakes and ponds as part of an overall integrated pest management program.



- 4. Company guarantees that all products used for treatment are EPA registered and labeled as appropriate and safe for use in lakes, ponds, and other aquatic sites, and are being applied in a manner consistent with their labeling.
- 5. All pesticide applications made directly to the water or along the shoreline for the control of algae, aquatic weeds, or other aquatic pests as specified in this contract will meet or exceed all of the Company's legal regulatory requirements as set forth by the EPA and related state agencies for NPDES and FIFRA. Company will perform treatments that are consistent with NPDES compliance standards as applicable in and determined by the specific state in which treatments are made. All staff will be fully trained to perform all applications in compliance with all federal, state, and local law.
- 6. Company will furnish the personnel, vehicles, boats, equipment, materials, and other items required to provide the foregoing at its expense.



Subsection 7H

Rule Governing Root Barrier Installation

Celebration Community Development District Rule Governing Installation of Root Barriers

Law Implemented: ss. 120.69, 190.011, 190.012, *Florida Statutes* (2022) Effective Date: April 25, 2023

In accordance with Chapters 190 and 120, Florida Statutes, and on April 25, 2023, at a duly noticed public meeting and after a duly noticed public hearing, the Board of Supervisors of the Celebration Community Development District ("District") adopted the following rules/policies to govern the requirement for the installation of root barriers on trees adjacent to the Celebration Community Development District-owned sidewalks, alleys, and other hardscape for all new installation and replacement hardwood trees. Any and all prior rules/policies of the District governing this subject matter are hereby rescinded.

- 1. **INTRODUCTION & FINDINGS.** This Rule Governing Installation of Root Barriers ("Rule") addresses the requirement for the installation of root barriers on trees adjacent to the District's sidewalks, alleys, and other hardscape for all new installations and replacements of hardwood trees ("Root Barriers"). The following findings are made and determined, and incorporated herein as the factual basis for this Rule:
 - a. The District is a unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to the Uniform Community Development District Act of 1980, as codified in Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes* ("Act"), by Chapter 42Q-1, Florida Administrative Code, adopted by the Florida Land and Water Adjudicatory Commission effective March 29, 1994.
 - b. Pursuant to the Act, the District is authorized to construct, acquire, and maintain infrastructure improvements, and services including, but not limited to landscaping, sidewalks, alley systems, and related improvements.
 - c. Section 190.012(3), *Florida Statutes* specifically provides the District with the authority to:
 - "adopt and enforce appropriate rules following the procedures of Chapter 120, *Florida Statutes*, in connection with the provision of one or more services through its systems and facilities;" and
 - d. The District constructed certain public rights-of-way and conveyed the asphalt roadbed area only ("curb-to-curb") to Osceola County; the District owns the lawn area and trees (from curb to sidewalk, a/k/a the verge/parkway) and the sidewalks, alleys, and other hardscape within the District ("**District Hardscape**").
 - e. Over the years, trees have been installed on lawns and in the verge/parkway areas without root barriers, and the tree roots are causing significant damage to District Hardscape, including uneven or irregular sidewalks, cracked asphalt, infrastructure and other damages, as well as an increase in personal injury cases related to alleged unsafe sidewalk or other conditions.

- f. It is in the best interest of the District to establish a rule for requiring root barriers on all new hardwood tree installations and hardwood tree replacements to protect District Hardscape, to minimize future costs for maintenance and repair of District Hardscape, as well as to protect the safety of the Districts' residents/landowners or the general public.
- 2. **ROOT BARRIER REQUIREMENTS.** Owners of individual lots, condominium, and homeowner associations, commercial property owner associations, developers, builders, contractors, and any other persons installing or replacing hardwood trees adjacent to District Hardscape (as applicable, the "Responsible Party"), are hereby required to install root barriers on all hardwood trees which are being replaced or newly installed on any real property adjacent to District Hardscape. The term "root barriers" shall mean an underground wall placed to block plant and tree roots that may be made of plastic, corrugated fiberglass, metal or fabric; root barrier depth should be at least three (3) to five (5) feet deep, with the top of the root barrier flush with the sidewalk or other hardscape. The Responsible Party is subject to the following conditions:
 - a. The Responsible Party shall be fully responsible for the installation, maintenance, cost and replacement of the root barriers. The Responsible Party shall be fully responsible for the replacement of sod and landscaping to any altered area(s) as a result of the installation, maintenance or replacement of the root barriers.
 - b. The Responsible Party shall be responsible for ensuring that the installation, maintenance, repair and/or replacement, of root barriers are conducted in compliance with all applicable laws, regulations, covenants, and codes.
 - c. The District, by adopting this Rule, does not represent that District has authority to provide all necessary approvals relating to the installation of root barriers. The Responsible Party is obligated to obtain any and all Association approvals (including Architectural Review, where applicable), permits, and other approvals relating to the root barriers and any related tree installation or replacement.
 - d. The Responsible Party shall ensure that the installation of root barriers does not damage any property of the District or any third-party's property. In the event of any such damage, the Responsible Party shall immediately repair the damage or compensate the District for such repairs, at the District's option.
 - e. Responsible Party's exercise of rights hereunder shall not interfere with other existing rights (e.g., drainage easements, utility easements). It shall be the Responsible Party's responsibility to locate and identify any and all such improvements and/or utilities.
 - f. Additionally, the Responsible Party shall keep the District Hardscape, the verge/parkway, and all District property free from any materialmen's or mechanic's liens and claims or notices in respect to such liens and claims, which arise by reason of the Responsible Party's exercise of rights under this Agreement, and the Responsible Party shall immediately discharge any such claim or lien.
- 3. **ENFORCEMENT.** For any and each violation of this Rule, the District shall additionally have the right to impose a fine of up to the amount of One Thousand Dollars and No Cents (\$1,000.00) and collect such fine plus its attorney's fees as a contractual lien or as otherwise provided pursuant to Florida law. Additionally, if any person is found to have committed any violation of this Rule, such person may additionally be subject to any applicable legal action, civil or criminal in nature.

- 4. **INDEMNIFICATION.** The Responsible Party agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Osceola County and the District, as well as any officers, supervisors, managers, lawyers, engineers, agents, and representatives of the foregoing, against all liability for damages and expenses resulting from, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the exercise of the rights granted hereunder.
- 5. **NOTICE.** This Rule, and all rights and obligations contained herein, shall run with the land and be deemed appurtenant to all lots adjoining the District Rights-of-Way. The District shall record a notice in the public records of Osceola County, Florida informing third parties of the existence of this Rule.
- 6. **SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY.** Nothing herein shall constitute or be construed as a waiver of the District's limitations on liability contained in Section 768.28, *Florida Statutes*, or other statutes or law.
- 7. **SEVERABILITY.** The invalidity or unenforceability of any one or more provisions of these policies shall not affect the validity or enforceability of the remaining provisions, or any part of the policies not held to be invalid or unenforceable.
- 8. **AMENDMENTS; WAIVERS.** The District in its sole discretion may amend or rescind this Rule, including any license or other rights granted hereunder, at any time and without further notice. Further, the District's Board by vote at a public meeting may elect in its sole discretion at any time to grant waivers to any of the provisions of this Rule on a case-by-case basis, and where doing so is in the best interest of the District.

We have reviewed your request below and would like to advise that Osceola County Transportation does not install mirrors for intersection control or any other traffic related conditions. We have completed a site visit to the location and based at the time of our visit there was no visibility limit looking from either direction of Celebration Ave. We did identify that there is parking allowed on Celebration Ave EB approaching Nash Dr which during evening hours when people are at home and cars being parked there it could cause some sight restrictions due to the curvature of the roadway. This is an issue that you would need to reach out to the officials of Celebration to ask for parking restrictions at that location. If they approve they would provide yellow curb painting advising No Parking to help increase visibility in the curve area.

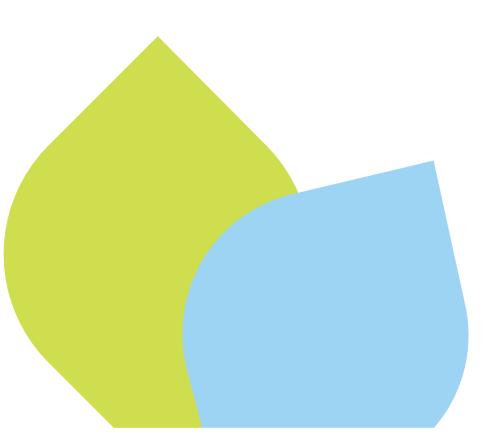

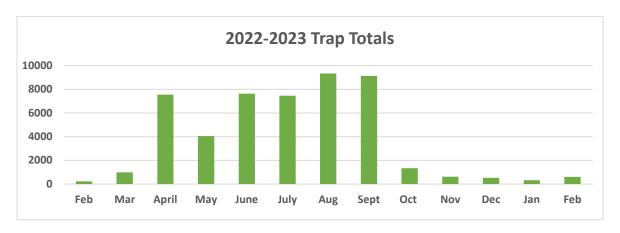
Surveillance

In an integrated mosquito management (IMM) program, surveillance is utilized for monitoring mosquito populations over time to understand local species mix, breeding habitats, population levels and the potential for arbovirus disease cycles. As Celebration has opted into Clarke's EarthRight® program, surveillance is conducted using Biogents traps and landing rate counts.

Biogents traps are specialized traps set in pre-determined locations to gain insights into mosquito counts, species, population dynamics, activity patterns and the presence of disease.

Merus is Organic Materials Review Institute (OMRI) Listed and meets the USDA's National Organic Program (NOP) standards for adult mosquito control in and around organic gardens, farms and over crops.

The remainder of ULV treatments will be applied using AquaAnvil® and AquaHalt®, water-based formulations with crop tolerance and residential area use labeling.

We have reviewed your request below and would like to advise that Osceola County Transportation does not install mirrors for intersection control or any other traffic related conditions. We have completed a site visit to the location and based at the time of our visit there was no visibility limit looking from either direction of Celebration Ave. We did identify that there is parking allowed on Celebration Ave EB approaching Nash Dr which during evening hours when people are at home and cars being parked there it could cause some sight restrictions due to the curvature of the roadway. This is an issue that you would need to reach out to the officials of Celebration to ask for parking restrictions at that location. If they approve they would provide yellow curb painting advising No Parking to help increase visibility in the curve area.
